



BISHOP'S MESSAGE

All Souls Day: A Phenomenon

Come November and most of our faithful get ready in many ways for celebrating the All Souls Day! For many of them more than the solemnity of All Saints Day a devoted observance of All Souls Day is important. This 2nd of November Frs. Basil Pereira and Thomas Vayalil remembered something quite interesting anecdote. They recalled the total curfew which followed the gruesome murder of the then Prime Minister Mrs. Indira Gandhi. As a consequence no Fathers could go to any village or tea garden for the Mass in the cemetery. They tried, but the police would not allow them to move. Consequently the people could not get Mass that day. On the following day a faithful accosted Fr. Thomas with the complaint

that he did not give them Mass. The priest

tried to explain the circumstances which did

not permit him. But the faithful would say, "all the same you should have come". Again

the priest explained, but the retort was:

"phir bhi" or "all the same" There was

no excuse! No matter what, the priest should have given them Mass!

The devotion for the Eucharist on All Souls Day is to be seen even today. No wonder most of our priests are busy practically the whole day giving Mass to different villages. Why such devotion? Why so particular about it?

Many years ago on my first ever visit to Shillong in a pre-Christmas week one Khasi seminarian was my guide. As we were passing through a cemetery he had asked me if I knew why in such great number the Khasis had accepted Christianity. I told him that I did not know. Then he explained to me that one of the reasons was the respect Christianity gives to the dead persons. This reason is also true of our Chotanagpur tribals. In their Sarna belief system the dead are not lost in the oblivion. They continue to exist in spirit. They still belong to the community!

The Church is a community of believers and among the believers are not only those who are living. Also the ones gone before us form a part of the community. There is a triumphant Church and a militant church. The Philippines express this sense of belonging by sharing meals in the graveyard. This sense of belonging surely assures that we pray earnestly for the souls in purgatory.

This devout observance also helps us prepare ourselves for a well prepared death. It's good to remember the dead very especially during the whole of November month and pray for them. May the souls of the faithful departed rest in peace by the mercy of God!

The theme of the Conference for this year was "Anticuum Ministerium of Ancient Ministry". The theme was mainly on the Lay Ministry of Catechesis. It focused on the ministry. identity, formation and types of lay catechists in the church namely, missionary

catechists, Sunday class catechists and religion class catechists. Very enlightening and relevant papers were presented on the theme. In addition to the papers presented by the experts, listening to the various voices from all over India was quite inspiring and enriching.

There was a half day program for the bungalow catechists in the Holy Cross Church Kharubhanga on the 20th of October 2022. CONVOCATION OF THEOLOGY DEPARTMENT AT MORNING STAR COLLEGE

The convocation for the Academic year 2022-23 was held on 31 October. There were 19 students from 9 different dioceses and 3 Religious Congregations who have completed their B. Th. studies. Of them one scored High Distinction (96%), two obtained distinctions (80-89%), 8 got High First Class (70-79%), and other 8 passed in first class (60-69%). They were awarded B.Th. certificates by his lordship Rt. Rev. Vincent Aind, the Bishop of Bagdogra diocese and the chairperson of the Governing Board. Emmanuel Uppamthadathil MSFS the rector of St Clement College, Nogaon, who was guest of honor, gave a very enlightening talk. His lordship Rt. Rev. Vincent Aind Bishop of Bagdogra also delivered a very inspirational message telling them that they must put into practice what they have learnt as they go about in their priestly ministry.

The same day in the evening the Albert's cultural academy under the guidance of Rev. Fr. Niraj Toppo organized a colorful cultural programme and bade the Fourth Year Brother Farewell. Bro. Robin Ekka raised the toast wishing them all well. Br. Gyandup on behalf of the 4th year students responded to the toast. As a concluding remark Fr. Rector congratulated them and wished them all the best for the future ministries in their respective dioceses and congregations.

At the end of their stay in the place, the students of 2nd Year Theology were intensified with the importance of saving the ecological system.

The students of 3rd Year Theology went to Holy Family Church, Kearchand the Santal Parish to have a course and to have an experience of Contextual Theology. For two days moderators Fr. Michael Pandian and Fr. Mohan Murmu meticulously guided the students in giving the necessary information about the Santal Tradition and culture. And on third day the students were sent to different villages two by two. They stayed in the particular villages for four days. And on fifth day they retuned back to Parish, and had sharing of experience and evaluation. It was a fruitful adventure for all the 3rd Years. They had rich experience with this exposure. By being with the family and people of those villages, Students learn ample of positive things to contextualize theology in different Contexts. The students of all the batches retuned back to Seminary on 18th of October, 2022.
