



BISHOP'S MESSAGE

We are in the synodal period up to 2024. Nay, this synodal call is to make the Church truly 'synodal' or to remind that the Church in its originality is (supposed to be) 'synodal'! Henceforth, the Church has to be nothing else but synodal.

The Holy Father promulgated the Apostolic Constitution on March 19, 2022, which is *Predicate Evangelium* (Preach the Gospel, henceforth PE). It is one of the most important legislative acts that Pope Francis has promulgated since his election in 2013. Almost a decade in the making, much of it has already been implemented along the way. The final document does make some significant changes and provides the vision of a Curia that is evangelical, service-oriented, promotes synodality, is shorn of careerism and highly professional. It was a modest attempt to discourage ambition and worldliness in the priesthood.

Although the PE is the latest work of Pope Francis, the aim and objective of this document is vividly clear in all his exhortations and writings. While the document is directly addressed to the Roman Curia in the Vatican, the contents are very well applicable to all of us, to the entire Church.

The document reminds us of the main task entrusted by the Lord Jesus (cf. Mk 16:15; Mt 10:7-8). This is not just a mandate, but it is also a call to the Church for rendering the first service

to each person and to all humanity. How does the Church do it? By bearing witness, in word and deed, to the mercy which she herself had freely received. We are exhorted to remember the example Our Lord Jesus himself gave, namely he washed the feet of his disciples. He also said that we shall be blessed if we do likewise (cf. Jn 13:15-17). [1] In this way, "the evangelizing community places itself through works and gestures in the daily lives of others, shortens distances, lowers itself to the point of humiliation if necessary, and takes on human life, touching the suffering flesh of Christ in the people" [2]. In doing so, the people of God fulfil the command of the Lord, who, in asking them to proclaim the Gospel, urged them to care for their weaker, sicker and suffering brothers and sisters.

It's a clarion call to us beginning with those of us in some or the other authority and trickling down to every single synodal traveller in faith to walk the path of humility, caring, listening and serving. Those of us who are in authority of some kind, shall we begin first and be examples for our fellow travellers?

On 21st January for all the staff of Seva Kendra a picnic was arranged at MM Terai to acknowledge their cooperation, hard work and team spirit in making the Jubilee function successful.

Gayaganga:

1. Awareness Program:

An Awareness Program was conducted on Tribal Land/Tea Garden Land/Land Right to Adivasi people of tea gardens on 22nd of January at Gayaganga Parish by Akhil Bharatiya Adivasi Vikas Parishad. This was a full day program.

Some 200 people had registered themselves for this program. Some NGOs and other social workers were also present. Fr. Donatus Tirkey TOR, Fr. Pascal Xalxo SJ and Fr. Joseph Xaxa too attended this seminar. The President of ABAVP Mr. Tez Kumar Toppo, Secretary Mr. Junas Kerketta, and Advocate Naveen Kerketta were the chief resource persons for this day. The resource persons explained the establishment of the tea gardens in Assam and Bengal. The Adivasi people from *Chotanagpur* were brought in this area to work in the tea gardens. Other aboriginals of Bengal did not want to work in the tea gardens as bonded labourers. So they left the place and settled in some other parts of Bengal and remained in agriculture. In the course of time these migrated *Adivasis* settled in Bengal and are still living in the land given by the tea companies. The government least bothers about the development of these people. The government gives more attention to Para, Bari, Guri, Jote etc. but not to the Lines, because these latter do not own the land for themselves. This program was organised to enlighten and awaken the tea garden people.



2. Praise and Worship:

Weekly praise and worship and adoration started by the Parishioners of Gayaganga in the Parish every Friday at 5:30 pm in this month of January. And they conclude with the Holy Mass. Faithful from neighbouring villages come for this service. Men actively participate in this prayer service. They themselves preach and make good prayers. –Fr. Joseph Xaxa
